These courses are designed to help learners develop communication skills and gain confidence in English to live and work in the UK and use English for international communication.


Elementary, Pre-Intermediate. [face-to-face, in college]

- Focus on all aspects of language – vocabulary, grammar, pronunciation
- Practise all four skills – reading, writing, listening, speaking
- Task based learning in pairs and groups
- Regular homework and assessments

Cambridge Exams preparation courses – three groups - First Certificate, Advanced and IELTS

Work towards gaining international qualifications recognised by companies and universities to work and study in the UK or abroad. [face-to-face, in college]

- Task-based methodology
- Extensive and in-depth language development
- Development of comprehension and productive skills for work/study purposes
- Regular assignments
- Practice using exam techniques

Entry requirements – you will be invited to attend an information session to assess your level and help you decide on the most suitable course.

Course fees – £150 for 16 weeks or £300 for 32 weeks. You will be required to pay course fees when you attend the information session, and you will not be accepted until payment has been received.
