Learning Objectives

This course is designed to help you improve your English language skills to prepare you for living, working and studying in the UK and to be able to use English for international communication.

Course outline

- strong focus on interactive communication for all levels

At lower levels, students will be introduced to basic grammar and vocabulary and there will be an emphasis on equipping students with the practical language and skills that they need to participate in everyday situations outside the classroom.

At higher levels, students' knowledge and use of language will be extended and refined and there will be a focus on exam skills and academic English.

Cost

Asylum Seekers and Refugees with evidence of status (e.g. BRP card or eVisa) are eligible for payment of course fees. Asylum Seekers are not eligible for bursary but can claim assistance with course materials and travel costs.

EU applicants: If you have settled status under the UK EU Settlement scheme, you may be eligible for a bursary.

For EU students arriving in the UK after 31st of December 2020 and starting their course in September 2021 and onwards, you will be classified as international student and will need to apply for a student visa, your course tuition fee will be in line with international fees.

International applicants: £7,500 subject to annual review

All students will need to buy course books – maximum £80.00. If you receive a bursary you will get an additional payment for your books. If you are an asylum seeker, we will provide you with books.

In order to be offered a place on the full-time course, applicants living locally must attend a group interview / information session and testing day between January - June to assess their level of English. Applicants living abroad will be asked to do a writing task which they return by email. They must then attend an information / testing day in August. All students will then be placed in a suitable ESOL group which may be in Gardyne Campus (Dundee) or Arbroath Campus.

If we do not have a class at your level, you will be referred to our ESOL partners for lessons with Dundee City Council, Angus Council or Dundee International Women's Centre.

Minimum enrolment age: 18, but we accept 16–17 year-olds who are living with a parent or guardian. Evidence will be required.

Qualifications and Assessment

Learners are assessed before the beginning of the course and are placed into a class of the appropriate level. Students have regular progress tests during the course. All students progress

towards SQA (Scottish Qualifications Authority) Units. These are compulsory and the fees are paid by the college. Depending on level, students may also progress towards Cambridge ESOL exams. The exams are optional, and the fees are paid by the students. These prices are set annually by Cambridge and are subject to change. Exams may be taken in Edinburgh at Basil Paterson or an authorised Cambridge exam centre.
