Financial Support



- Students studying at Adv Cert. level are likely to have their course fees paid for them in the majority of cases and may be eligible to apply for bursary funding, travel, childcare support – speak to our team at the Help Points to see what you are entitled to
- Students studying at HNC/D level may be eligible to have their course fees paid for them by Student Awards Agency Scotland and may be able to apply for further financial support too. Again, speak to our staff on our Help Points to discuss what you could be entitled to

Student Funding

- DUNDEE AND ANGUS COLLEGE
- Once you have received an offer of a place from the College you will receive information on how to apply for funding
- At HNC/D levels you could apply to SAAS for Course Fees, Bursary and access Student Loans (separate organisation)
- Apply for funding as soon as possible at HN level this means you can apply even if your offer is only 'conditional'
- Applications for SAAS funding usually open in April – if you delay your application until late summer, your application is likely to be delayed significantly
