LANTRA Qualifications: Heavy Machinery Courses

Tractor Driving

Duration: 2 days **Location**:

Arbroath or Kingsway Campus

We offer adult courses and versions for 12–15 year olds as well as refresher courses. The course includes use of 3 point linkage, trailers and Power Take-Off (PTO).

Counter-balance Fork Lift Truck

Duration: 1–7 days

(depending on experience)

Operation of a forklift truck for warehouse or yard operation for loading.



Rough Terrain Telescopic Fork Lift Truck

Duration: 1–7 days

(depending on experience)

Location: On-site at client location with

own equipment

Operation of an all-terrain truck for loading operations, typically farm use.



360 Degree Excavator (below 10 tonnes)

Duration: 1–7 days

(depending on experience)

Operation of (mini-digger) excavator for landscaping use.

Woodchipper

Duration: 1 day

Location:

Operation of a range of arboricultural trailed woodchippers.

Loading Shovel

Duration: 1–7 days

(depending on experience)

Location:

Arbroath or Kingsway Campus

Typically Avant-style multi-functional loader machines used by the landscape industry.







City & Guilds | NPTC **Qualifications: Pesticides Courses**

These certificates are a legal requirement for spraying pesticides outside of personal domestic use.

PA6A – Operating Pedestrian Handheld Applicators

Duration: 1 day of training, followed by a practical assessment usually held the next week

Location: Arbroath or Kingsway Campus / On-site for client

Required for knapsack spraying (walking with a pesticide sprayer).

PA6INJ – Operating Hand **Held Pesticide Injection Equipment**

Duration: 1 day of training, followed by a practical assessment usually held the next week

Location: Arbroath or Kingsway Campus / On-site for client

Required to carry out stem injection of pesticides into individual plants (e.g. Japanese Knot Weed & Giant Hogweed Control).



LANTRA versions of these qualifications are also available.

PA1 - Safe Use of **Pesticides**

Duration: 1 day with assessment **Location**: Arbroath or Kingsway Campus / On-site for client

This theory training must be completed before any other pesticide elements.

PA6AW - Operating Pedestrian Handheld Applicators to Apply Pesticides To or Near Water

Duration: 1 day of training, followed by a practical assessment usually held the next week

Location: Arbroath or Kingsway Campus / On-site for client

Required by law for use of pesticides at or near water.

PA6PP - Installing Pesticide Plugs in Tree Stumps

Duration: 1 day of training, followed by a practical assessment usually held the next week

Location: Arbroath or Kingsway Campus / On-site for client

Required to prevent regrowth of felled trees.

Health & Safety Training

Qualsafe Awards is the largest Awarding Organisation for First Aid qualifications in the UK.

First Aid at Work

Duration: 3 days

Location:

All campuses / On-site for client

Covers basic first aid procedures assessing an incident, managing an unresponsive casualty, CPR, heart attacks, choking, head and spinal injuries, fractures, anaphylaxis and more.

This qualification will enable you to keep your staff safe and meet health and safety regulations. First Aid is a useful and vital skill to have in any business, especially in a trade oriented environment. Successful completion of this course gives the learner a **Qualsafe First Aid at Work Certificate which** qualifies them as a workplace first aider and is valid for three years.

Emergency First Aid at Work

Duration: 1 day

Location:

All campuses / On-site for client

Covers managing an unresponsive casualty, CPR, choking, shock, wounds and bleeding and minor injuries. First Aid is a useful and vital skill to have, especially for those working in land-based environments and using heavy machinery.

Successful completion of this course gives the learner a Qualsafe Emergency First Aid at Work Certificate which is valid for three years and qualifies them as a workplace emergency first aider.







Managing Safely

IOSH is designed to help businesses bring safety to the forefront of their practices, helping them to look after staff and reduce costs. It does this by reducing the amount of accidents and preventing sickness as well as enhancing the business reputation as a high quality and efficient workforce.

- Assessing risks
- Controlling risks
- Understanding responsibilities
- Understanding hazards
- Investigating incidents
- Measuring performance

Working Safely

Horticulture Apprenticeships

The Modern Apprenticeship programme combines paid employment with work-based training, leading to industry-recognised vocational qualifications and allowing employees to advance their skills and credentials without the need for full-time study.



If your employee is aged between



16 and 24

the apprenticeship qualification will be fully-funded *

* If your employee is over the age of 24 a top-up fee may be required.

Why choose an apprenticeship with D&A College?

- Work-based learning, one day a week at the college's Kingsway Campus allows apprentices to earn as they learn and gain valuable knowledge and skills to apply in the workplace.
- Our courses are funded through Skills Development Scotland (criteria dependent)
- Apprentices receive recognised SQA qualifications
- Courses are apprentice led, so they can work at their own pace with up to 18 months to complete
- Our courses mix practical and theory across various aspects of horticulture and are backed up with industry speakers, lectures with external visitor demonstrations and practical tasks
- Optional enhancements can be built into the course and can include First Aid, PA1 and PA6 spraying certificates, as well as digger and tractor training
- Support throughout the course from assessors, support staff and the Learning and Digital Resources Team
